



We believe that as the most impactful education management services company in Egypt, with 15K students in our schools and nurseries and north of 4 million students using our content learning guides, not only do we have to stand on solid and clear mission and vision statements, but more importantly, we have to take all the right actions in order to stay true to them every single day. In the coming section, I will demonstrate our new mission and vision statements, along with some actions taken to prepare for the next academic year that embody how we are fully committed to them.

EEP's New Mission Statement

To offer top-quality, innovative, and safe educational models, providing a personalized experience to our students' learning journeys and nurturing their diverse skillsets to become tomorrow's global leaders. We are relentlessly focused on developing our teachers' capabilities and empowering them with the latest progressive technologies to prepare our students with not only the knowledge but also the character, integrity, and resilience needed to thrive in a rapidly changing world.

EEP's New Vision Statement

Creating a brighter future for our students, empowering them to unlock their potential every day.

At the heart of our futuristic mission statement, you will find words like quality, innovation, and well-being standing out. For us, these are not just words, but they serve as a guide to every single action, decision, investment, and commitment the EEP team has made in preparation for the next academic year and years to come. Few examples to follow:

We have screened more than 2000 resumes to recruit 100 new teachers, indicating a pass rate of 5% to ensure top-quality teacher hiring.

We invested > 2 million dollars in facility uplifts and upgrades across all sites to ensure a safer, more pleasant, and better learning environment for our students as they come back to school.

We launched a comprehensive Education Uplift Capabilities Program led by our Central Education Unit focused on Innovation, Careers, Professional Development, and Safeguarding:

Innovation: We will be using multiple Alenabled resources to help better personalized learning experiences for our students; we will be upgrading the ICT curriculum to become more enabling and future-relevant by integrating coding and prompt engineering topics to be taught to our students; and finally, we are integrating more technology in our day-to-day learning to significantly advance students capabilities.

Careers: We are restructuring our career pathways with more internationally versed university fairs; we are adding many more companies and more diversified fields in our internship programs to give a more unique experience for our students; and we have also launched the EEP Study Abroad Scholarship Program to two of our top students who are going to Glasgow and South Hampton Universities in the UK. This program is aimed at broadening the horizon of our students' mindset when it comes to their career choices and aspirations in order to really unlock their full potential.

Safeguarding: Current world pressures have been mounting on our families and students. As an education entity, we have to put a lot of educated effort into creating the right environment for our students to flourish. Safeguarding has been and continues to be at the forefront of EEP's priority list in order to ensure a safe, stable, and happy environment for our students. Continuous training for our staff, awareness building via positive reinforcement for our students, along with disciplined handling of incidents when needed, continue to be our recipe for creating a balanced environment that guarantees the emotional, psychological, and mental well-being of our students.

Professional Development: Our teachers continue to be the driving force of the education process. We do our best to show our admiration and appreciation for their efforts by being very adamant about building their capabilities and capacities through investing in top-quality and progressive professional development programs such as EEP's unique Grow Our Own program, which aims to empower exceptional co-teachers and nominates them for the International Postgraduate Secondary Education certificate, in addition to an extensive job shadowing program, allowing teachers to gain hands-on experience by observing a proficient educator as they work to learn about teaching best practices.



Moreover, we offer various opportunities for professional growth and development through access to local and international educational conferences, such as our very own EEP Con, bringing together educators across our schools for an unparalleled collaborative learning event; the IB Global Conference taking place this year in Budapest; the Near East South Asia (NESA) 2024 Fall Leadership Conference in Dubai; the Mediterranean Association of International Schools (MAIS) Annual Conference in Cairo; and the 2025 British Schools in the Middle East (BSME) Annual Conference in Abu Dhabi, just to name a few.

Our extensive professional development program is twofold: attracting and retaining the best possible talent at both the school and corporate levels. This strategic approach ensures that individuals are placed in roles that align with their strengths and contribute to the growth of EEP and its assets while advancing their own career journeys. On a school level, this directly contributes to the schools' success by encouraging every senior leadership team member, teacher, and co-teacher to give their best. When surrounded by inspiring and proficient educators, our students are empowered to reach their full potential.

On a larger community level, EEP is equally committed to corporate social responsibility as the education partner for Right to Dream Egypt Academy. Through this partnership, EEP has successfully aligned the academy's national curriculum with international

standards through our unique Prime National Schools (PNS) model, equipping students with the necessary skills for academic and athletic success. EEP's role extends beyond student education, encompassing teacher and staff upskilling initiatives. The academy's recent achievements, including the successful graduation of its first class and the admission of a new cohort, highlight its ability to provide diverse pathways for aspiring student-athletes.

Our relentless commitment to excellence has yielded significant results. We have been rewarded in our admissions growth numbers with stellar growth rates of 21% and top-notch academic results across all our schools and graduating cohorts, with IB schools averaging 33 vs. 30 global averages, with 30% of British schools'students achieving 9-7 (A*-A) in IGCSE and 32% earning A*-A in A Levels, significantly outperforming the England averages of 20.9% and 27.6%, respectively. Our national schools were no exception, with 42% of the cohort exceeding the 80% mark.

Growing while sustaining benchmark academic results reassures us that we are doing the right thing and fuels our motivation to keep aiming at realizing our vision of creating a brighter future for our students every day, via staying committed to investing in Egypt in terms of quality of education and further footprint expansion across the country.

I still recall a fascinating lecture on the invention of the telephone. It was predicted that when telephones were used by the masses, cities would diminish in size as people would be able to work on their farms, reducing the need for inperson collaboration. We know the opposite is true. As technology evolves and we are able to communicate more easily, our social nature leads us to want to spend more time together, not less. Hence, technological advances have led to cities growing instead of shrinking.

In speaking at a recent conference, I referred to 1996, when I had just returned from Australia to Canada. My friend complained that I hadn't sent him many postcards during my year studying abroad. I was able to tell him about a new thing called 'electronic mail' that utilized the 'internet', which was new to us.

When reflecting on the changes that have taken place since the mid-1990s, it's fair to say that we now live in a completely different world. Today, we are on the cusp of a much bigger transformational change in society, specifically in education and how we learn.

Artificial intelligence (AI) has been available to the masses for just over a year and has the potential to take any given student of average ability and make them exceptional, as each and every student can have their own exceptional AI tutor. As for teachers, AI will enable every teacher to have an amazing AI assistant to support them in their work.

We are already ahead of the curve at EEP, with our Director of Innovation and Educational Technology, Sherif Nabawy, supporting both the Central Education Unit (CEU) and working with teachers across our entire platform to show them how we can use AI to enhance personalized learning for each one of our students.

We are in the final stages of updating our 3-year innovation roadmap, which includes setting challenging goals and creating action plans for all our schools in the following areas:


Building a Network:




STEM Fair 2024



Fostering Student Well-being

At GEMS TBS, our whole school culture embraces the strong correlation between well-being and academic progress: our students' pastoral needs are our collective duty of care.

Our staff work collaboratively, triangulating academic data alongside that of attendance and behavioral/ emotional concerns to ensure that all students' wellbeing is accounted for One data source for behavioral/ emotional concerns is the Y2-12 GL PASS survey (Pupil Attitude towards Self and School), which we use to identify individual concerns and areas for support across the community. The analysis of trends from "Guard" data, EEP's platform for reporting and documenting safeguarding incidents, also provides us with an insight into the changing pastoral needs of our students, particularly at pressure points for our older students during exam times. We then integrate ways to support students into our personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education curriculum, assemblies, and planned events, e.g., Anti-bullying Odd and Mental Health Week.

The involvement of parents in this process is key, as is participation in meetings 'around the child' based on classroom and playground observations and data analysis. Involving our Inclusion Team and our Careers and University Counselling Department in these meetings ensures that support is individualized for each student. Support can be further supplemented by our 1:1 mentoring sessions for students and advice

for parents facing challenges at home.


We aim to provide a safe space for students to express concerns and seek help without fear of judgment. By valuing student voice through our school councils from Y1-12, where representatives from each class can share ideas from the wider community, we ensure that we are actively listening to the needs of students and the challenges they are facing in an ever-changing world. Our many committees, such as Environmental Awareness, Uniform, and Canteen, allow more students to participate in a variety of events that are initiated by themselves.



Are there more things we can do? Yes, and we are constantly reviewing the impact of initiatives and listening to our students and parents on how best we can equip them for their next learning journey.










TBS SCIENCE FAIR GEMS TBS is all about innovation


How does one describe the innovative classroom of the future?






Mother and Child Pizza Making Extravaganza
















Career Guidance Initiatives



The impressive achievements of EEP students across various academic competitions throughout the year reflect the commitment to innovation that EEP instills within its student body.

Challenge of the Pharaohs

For the fourth year in a row, several schools competed at EEP's flagship competition, the Challenge of the Pharaohs, devising innovative projects and solutions to address vital issues in line with the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This edition, students were encouraged to identify a single, actionable change, Just 1 Thing, to create a positive environmental impact in their homes, schools, and communities, aligned with UN SDG 14: Life Below Water and SDG 15: Life on Land.

The competition featured GEMS BISM, GISC, MLS, and MILS, with GEMS TBS as the hosting school. Winning the competition for their creativity, the MILS student team captivated the audience with their song, "The Secret of Life," which they beautifully composed and performed. They also presented an array of innovative projects, such as the preparatory stage's MILS Recycling Initiative, the EcoGuardians initiative, and the French School's project, ZERO Plastique.

GISC's students emerged victorious across three project categories. The MYP2 students' "Sustainable Fashion" project won first place in the 'Community' category, while one of GISC's Grade 1 students promoted water conservation with the winning "Saving Water at Home" project in the 'Home' category. In the 'School' category, Pre-KG students impressed everyone with their "Bird Feeder" project, winning first place.

The students at **MLS** created a biodiverse garden featuring a variety of plants, categorized into aromatic, edible, and flowering types, which helped them secure first place in the 'School' category. Tackling real-world challenges with innovative solutions and transforming them into positive habits, students worked on other creative projects, some of which were "Aloe Bliss," an eco-friendly product using fresh aloe vera, and "Mr. Jsy Bakery," a new bread line easily baked at home with fewer carbs and more proteins, fibers, and minerals.



GEMS BISM's secondary stage students created "The Green Club," which led various projects to raise awareness about the importance of recycling. This initiative includes a dedicated classroom recycling program where Green Club members collect recyclables directly from teachers during lunch breaks every Monday and Wednesday, in addition to reminding students to utilize designated recycling bins throughout breaks to promote responsible waste management. Moreover, students started an urban garden initiative, where they planted a variety of fruits and vegetables and planned regular visits to maintain and water the garden.

As for **GEMS TBS**, students showcased various creative solutions to tackle real-life issues, proving that small actions can indeed have a big impact on our environment, from addressing the impact of plastic pollution and water conservation to animal protection and reducing our carbon footprint, in addition to an innovative coastal cleaner recyclable device.

IgnitED

GEMS BISM, WILS, and SILS students showcased their talents at the prestigious ignitED competition held at the Grand Egyptian Museum under the Ministry of Higher Education, competing against over 40 teams from 23 schools. WILS students across 13 teams impressed with innovative applications: "Pyra Tourism" to assist tourists and "Pharaoh's Compass" as a virtual guide, both designed to promote Egyptian tourism. Meanwhile, SILS students across 17 teams participated in the robotics and application invention categories. Among the innovative projects was "Robocop," a robot that helps tourists navigate diverse monuments across the country and gives background information about each one. Presenting a unique way to facilitate sightseeing, another team built "Tut," an application that helps tourists find all the information they need to enjoy visiting each attraction, winning the "Best Creative Idea Award" for their project. Moreover, GEMS BISM was honored with the prize for the best-participating team. This event provided a platform for students from both schools to develop well-rounded innovation skills, including technical expertise, creativity, and teamwork, as they tackled real-world challenges through their projects.

Codeavour

WILS and SILS students aced the biggest coding and Al competition in the Middle East, Codeavour 5.0. With 350 groups and over 600 students from all over Egypt participating, the competition allowed our students to put their digital skills to the test, showcasing their problem-solving and critical-thinking skills. From WILS, there was the first-place winner "E-COVER" by Smart Group and two second-place winners "Chroma Speeder" by Color Rush Group and "Smart Pet House. The SILS Team, Ghost Chasers, received the title for Best Idea with their innovative take on the classic Pac-Man game. creating both a physical prototype and a digital version on Scratch. The team, Maze Runner, secured second place by engineering a medical aid support robot using Lego Spike and designing their own manufacturing hub environment. It is also worth noting that our students scored over 90% on their projects.



Robofest

SILS and WILS students achieved remarkable results at the Robofest-Egypt competition held at Wellington International School in Alexandria. A total of 12 teams, comprised of students from both schools, collaborated to design, build, program, and operate autonomous robots. Robofest is an international competition by Lawrence Technological University in Michigan, with Egypt's edition featuring 125 teams from across the country competing in various categories. It provided a platform for students to showcase their critical thinking, creativity, and the technical skills nurtured through their schools' innovative programs. Their hard work was rewarded as they secured multiple awards across various categories, including the Best Teamwork Award, the Best Artistic and Creativity Award, the Best Programming Award, the Rising Star Award, the Best Project Award, the Best Strategy Award, the Best Design Award, and the Robo Exhibition Category.





International Science & Engineering Fair (ISEF)

Showcasing groundbreaking projects that left a lasting impression on judges and attendees, MILS students excelled at the US-based International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF), one of the strongest international competitions in the field of science and engineering. With growing concerns over fossil fuel depletion and environmental degradation, MILS students' projects offered various sustainable alternatives. Akram Sherif, Mohammed Medhat, Youssef M. Ibrahim, Yahia Ayman, and Omar Tamer collaborated on a practical and ecofriendly biofuel solution that garnered significant attention and praise. They also worked on a series of innovative aids designed to enhance the lives of visually impaired individuals. Their Smart Bracelet and Smart Shoes integrate cutting-edge technology to provide greater independence and safety.

World Scholar's Cup

Hayah Main Campus and GEMS TBS students participated in the World Scholar's Cup, an international academic games competition that is held in hundreds of schools around the world every year. Students displayed dedication, commitment, and exceptional skills leading up to and throughout the event. They spent an exciting, fun-filled, and enriching experience debating controversial, hot topics like the implications of advances in AI, the pros and cons of cryptocurrency, and other new developments that impact our societies. Students participating in the World Scholar's Cup take part in writing and trivia challenges that revolve around the topics announced for the current year. Our students engaged in spirited debates with confidence and eloquence, displaying articulation, critical thinking, and the ability to defend their stance, which impressed both their judges and their peers. The GEMS TBS team was extremely successful, gaining many accolades and qualifying for the Global Rounds. The Hayah Main Campus students won various silver and gold medals.



International Kangaroo Mathematics Contest

Their programs invite students to create and develop their own social enterprises. 
