







Engaging with the arts strengthens cognitive skills such as observation, pattern recognition, spatial reasoning, and fine motor skills. These skills are invaluable not only in the arts but across various academic disciplines.

As for the soft skills outlined in the IB Learner Profile, art encourages students to be risk-takers, open-minded, communicators, and reflective. The arts provide students with a platform to express their emotions both abstractly and concretely. Emotional expression helps students process experiences, develop empathy, and navigate the complexities of human emotions, thereby building stronger interpersonal relationships. It teaches them to be open-minded about others' experiences and to reflect on their own.

Many art forms, including theatre and music, are inherently collaborative and require strong communication skills to successfully complete a production. Students learn to work effectively in teams, communicate their ideas clearly, and respect diverse perspectives. Anyone who has ever performed on stage in front of an audience understands the level of risk-taking required in such a setting.

Now, approximately 2,000 young artists from across the country have the opportunity to showcase their skills and gain recognition for their creativity. In past years, schools from the UAE and KSA have also participated.

The competition's categories have expanded over time to encompass a wider range of visual arts, including collage, 3D art, digital art, and photography. A panel of professional artists and educators from diverse backgrounds and disciplines judges the entries.

Each year features thought-provoking and unique themes designed to inspire reflection and challenge students' creativity, encouraging a deeper understanding of the world. These themes complement classroom learning and foster values such as compassion and tolerance. Past themes include "The Power in Me," "Ancient Civilizations," "Faces of Egypt," and "Innovation vs. Preservation."

A few years ago, the competition expanded its reach with the "Beyond Schools" initiative, extending invitations and support to non-governmental organizations and institutes. These NGOs, using art as a therapeutic and expressive outlet for underprivileged students, bring a unique dimension to our annual exhibition. 







# MLS CARNIVAL







This experience, inspired by the values of compassion and community taught in Religion and Quran classes, allowed students to share smiles, stories, and support. The trip was a small step that made a big difference in the lives of the children they visited.

Grade 6 students are also taking action to keep their community clean. They created vibrant posters to raise awareness about reducing litter and food waste, inspiring peers and the wider community to join the movement for a cleaner, greener future.

The Hayah West Parent Teacher Association (PTA) introduced two after-school clubs in partnership with Nawrna, a nonprofit dedicated to educational initiatives. The Science Club and Programming Club were an instant success, fully booked with eager middle school students.

Additionally, Hayah West students have organized numerous charity activities, including a Bake Sale and a School Bag Drive, aimed at supporting underprivileged students and the dedicated support staff at the school.







### **GISC:**Giving Back with Heart

At GISC, service to the community is a core value. Students have engaged in a variety of initiatives this year, including organizing a blanket drive, leading environmental clean-up campaigns, and launching the "Pay It Forward" project. This initiative focused on supporting the school's blue-collar staff by giving back to their families in meaningful ways. These projects have helped students develop leadership skills, empathy, and a deeper understanding of social responsibility, leaving a lasting impact on both the community and the students themselves.

The school also held a Winter Blanket Drive, ensuring that children in two orphanages received blankets, winter clothes, and a heater, spreading warmth and joy.


# **GEMS BISM:**

### Innovating Classroom Learning Through LEGO-Based STEAM Education

Educators at AIA and MLS participated in the "Teaching with LEGO Essential and Prime: Engineering, Coding, and Creativity" training led by Sherif Nabawy, EEP's Innovation and EdTech Director, and Hebba Haroun, EEP's EdTech Innovation and Curriculum Specialist. Teachers explored LEGO Essential and Prime kits, integrating engineering, coding, and creativity into STEAM education. This training helped educators support students for the EEP Innova8 competition.

#### **Enhancing Teaching Methodologies with Design Thinking**

At AIA, PYP teachers participated in a dynamic session on the Design Thinking Process led by Hebba Haroun. The session, aligned with AIA's Program of Inquiry (POI), introduced educators to innovative methodologies that enhance student creativity and problem-solving skills. By embedding design thinking principles into their teaching strategies, educators are better equipped to create engaging and impactful learning experiences.





#### **Advancing Digital Literacy**

In line with fostering a responsible digital culture, GISC parents participated in a valuable session on digital literacy, led by Hebba Haroun. The workshop emphasized positive online behavior, addressed student challenges, and encouraged parents to lead by example in creating a respectful and safe digital environment.

# Safeguarding and Student Well-Being: A Core Priority

A safeguarding training was conducted at MLS for new teachers, while a refresher session was provided for returning educators by Noha Morsy, EEP's Deputy Director of Education and Safeguarding Manager. At SILS and WILS, staff members completed an intensive safeguarding program, also led by Noha Morsy and Engy Hammam, EEP's Safeguarding Lead, focusing on recognizing and responding to potential child abuse or neglect cases.

Additionally, GISC hosted a comprehensive safeguarding workshop for its blue-collar workers led by Noha Morsy, emphasizing the importance of vigilance in identifying and reporting potential concerns. In parallel, EEP's Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) from multiple schools, including GEMS TBS, MLS, MILS, GISC, AIA, and GEMS BISM, completed Level 3 safeguarding training.

# Preparing for Emergencies with Health, Safety, and Environment (HSE) Training

As part of EEP's commitment to maintaining secure learning environments, Hoda Gamal, EEP's HSE Manager, led an emergency preparedness training session at GISC. The session covered response protocols for fire and lockdown scenarios, equipping staff with the necessary skills to execute swift and orderly evacuations. A fire drill followed the training, reinforcing the importance of calm and coordinated responses in emergency situations.

# Professional Growth Through Cross-School Collaboration

In an effort to promote professional collaboration, GISC hosted educators from AIA for a job-shadowing initiative under the EEP Job Shadowing Program. This experience allowed teachers to observe best teaching practices, exchange knowledge, and refine their instructional approaches. Later, GISC also hosted fellow educators from WILS, further enriching the exchange of expertise and strengthening professional growth across EEP schools.
